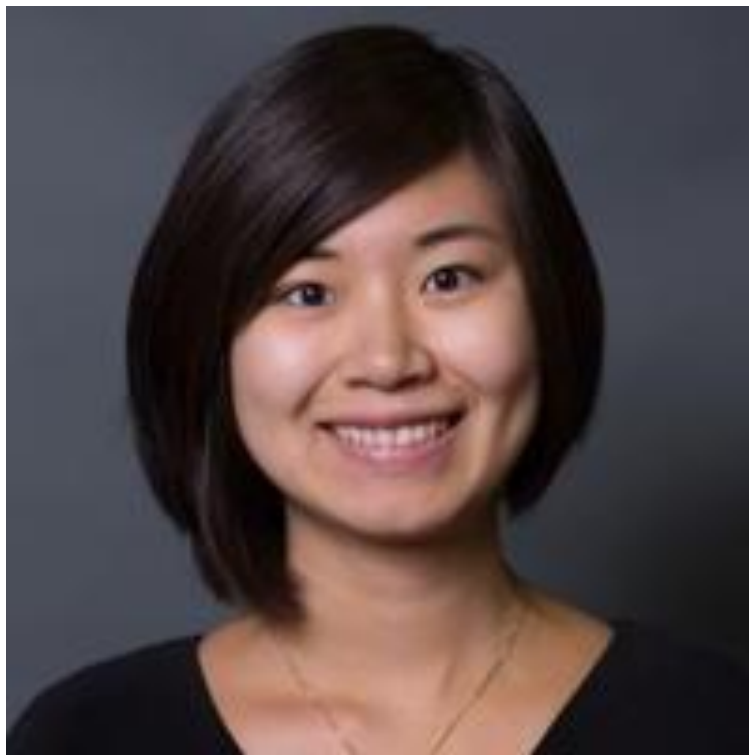
Research Project Announcement

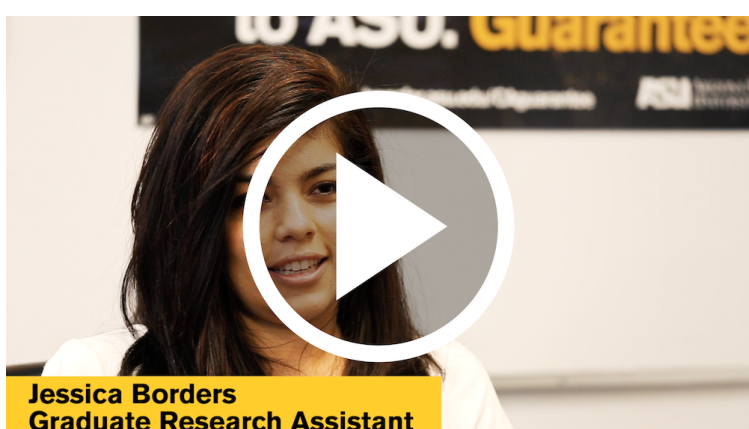
Chun Tao Travel Blog
